Each year, the Webster Schroeder Varsity boy's lacrosse team participates in a community service project that is designed to teach the boys what it means to give back. This year, in association with the Webster Lacrosse Club, the team has decided to put on a lacrosse clinic for kids in grades 2 through 8. All proceeds for the event will be given to CURE Childhood Cancer Association (<http://curekids cancer.com>). The clinic will be held on Saturday, May 3rd from 9:30 AM to 12:00 PM. The event will take place on the turf at Webster Schroeder High School and the cost of the clinic is \$35 per player. CURE kids and their siblings will not be charged.

Headlining the event as the main instructors will be Ryan Powell and The Rochester Rattlers. Powell is a four time All-American who played at Syracuse University. He later went on to play for the US National Team and then professionally in the MLL for our hometown Rochester Rattlers.

Schroeder Varsity Lacrosse Coach, John McGurk said: 'I am excited that our boys have decided to help such a worthy organization as CURE Childhood Cancer Association. Having Ryan Powell and The Rochester Rattlers give of their time to help your boys raise money for CURE is very humbling. The kids that attend are in for a great day of skill based training as well as how to take the things learned on the field and apply them to leadership skills that can be used in all aspects of life. Please come out and spend a few hours having some fun while at the same time helping raise money for a fantastic organization.'

The Sackett family became acquainted with CURE when their daughter Karleigh was diagnosed with neuroblastoma. Karleigh's mom, Erin, added the following, 'When your child is diagnosed with cancer it is shocking and overwhelming, to say the least. It affects absolutely every aspect of your family. CURE Childhood Cancer Association is steered by parents of children who have had cancer. They know what families are enduring and strive to assist them in ways that, we know first-hand, are invaluable. We are grateful for CURE and thankful for community events like this held to support them.' Karleigh has been cancer free for 18 months. The Sacketts have twin boys that play in the Schroeder lacrosse program.
